



Introduction MY **SCHOOL** "hæfkjfkfkfkf" LOO



One thing unites all children, men and women around the world. We need to go to the loo ... day after day. ... and we all want to have a nice toilet.

But toilets need to be clean and safe too. Why? In our faeces we find tiny living beings. We call them bacteria, viruses, worms or simply just germs. Some of these germs are dangerous and they make us sick.

These germs are tricky, because they are so tiny, we cannot see them. They spread from faeces to other children though dirty hands, messy playgrounds, or even through flies legs.

It's up to us to keep our toilets nice and safe and clean, at home or at school. It needs you, your teacher, your janitor, your principle and your parents. Let's do it together!

So it's up to all of us to keep our environment free from faeces and germs, no matter where we are.

You will see, there is a lot to learn. My School Loo will show us, how we can stay healthy and maintain nice and clean toilets, together as one.

"Let's open the box and have some fun: The poster will tell you, what's in the box and how the games, comics and materials work."



Example

- » Choose a card out of one of the stories and discuss it in groups, or with your class. Can you describe what is happening in the picture?
- » Discuss each picture, agree on the answer and tell it out loud to your classmates.
- » Once you have discussed the pictures, you should try to put all card of each set in the correct order and come up with a full story.

For teachers It is always a good learning experience to guide students from mistakes to correct solutions. Placing the cards in the correct order to create the stories as they are being told in the comic posters could be one possible final result to which the teacher can guide the class.








Memory Game 2

There are nine matching pairs of pictures within this game, which show different situations. The team who finds the most matching pairs is the winner of the game.

The tricky part is, that the matching pairs are not exactly the same pictures. They do show the same situation, yet, one situation is good and the one situation is bad. For example: The picture shows a girl. In the good picture, the girl is fit and healthy. In the bad picture, the girl is very sick. Have a look at the back of each picture, you will see some clues that will help you identifying which of the pictures is good or bad.





- » Form a team of 2-5 players
- Goal of the game: Find the most matching pairs of GOOD and BAD memory cards
- » Mix up the GOOD cards and separately mix the BAD cards and put them in rows, face down. You need to have the GOOD cards on one side and the BAD cards on the other side. GOOD © / BAD ©
- » Turn over one card from the GOOD side and one card from the BAD side. If the two pictures match and you can explain why, keep them. If they don't match, turn them back over.
- » Remember what picture each card was showing and where it was. Watch and remember during the other player's turn. The game is over when all the cards have been matched.

Puppet Theatre & Drawings •





- » Create your own puppet theatre to show and tell your story about sanitation and hygiene in your
- » You can use the coloured puppet characters for your theatre, the black/white versions can be coloured in, or you can even make your own scenery and characters.
- » Be creative! You can use many materials for the scenery that can be found at home or in nature, like coloured cloths and leaves, or cardboard. For the puppets' handles you can attach sticks or
- small branches onto the cuttings. There are endless
- » Show your friends, family and classmates what you have learned about sanitation by presenting them a puppet show, just like you have seen in the comics. Tell the stories you have learnt from the comics, or make up your own toilet or handwashing story.
- » There are even more ways of using the puppet theatre and the drawing outlines, for example for sanitation collages, to hang up on the wall. Have



Card Game

Health Cards (24)

Each player gets 4 HEALTH cards depicting healthy and ill children. Defend your healthy children during the game. Each time you fail, turn over the card and a child gets sick. You are out of the game, when all your 4 children become ill.

Threat Cards & Defense Cards (2 x 24)

If a player plays a green THREAT card (poo with germs or hand with germs cards), the next player must respond with a corresponding blue DEFENSE card (toilet or soap card), in order to protect a child from getting sick.

Special Cards (24)

There are 4 types of special cards: The FLY card (12), the FOOD card (5), the TOILETLESS COMMUNITY card (5) and the TOTAL SANITATION card (2)



- » Form a group of 4-6 players. Each player places 4 HEALTH cards (2 boys and 2 girls) in front of him/ her. The blue healthy children are facing up. A player must turn these cards over when his/her children get ill. If all four children are ill, the player is out of the game. If you are less than 6 players, put the rest of the HEALTH cards aside.
- » **Goal of the game:** Stay healthy. The player, who remains healthy for the longest time, wins.
- » Shuffle rest of the cards. Each player receives 4 cards. The remaining cards are on one pile in the middle, face down. You always have to have 4 cards in your hands, so draw new card from the pile, after playing one.
- » Turns follow the clockwise direction. The player sitting left of the dealer begins by playing any of the cards in his/her hand. If a player successfully protects his/her health, it is the next players turn. If a player cannot protect him/herself, one HEALTH card has to be turned over and a child gets sick.

"Beat the Germs and stay healthy"

















- » If a FOOD card is played, every player must play a Soap card, in order to wash hands before eating. If you cannot protect your health with soap, you have to turn over a HEALTH card.
- » If a TOILETLESS COMMUNITY card is played, every player must play a TOILET card, in order to stop going to toilet in the open. If you cannot protect your health with a toilet, you have to turn over a
- » The FLY card can pass germs to someone else. The one who plays the fly decides, whose turn it is next. The appointed player must now react to whatever card was played before the fly, or play another fly.
- » The TOTAL SANITATION cards can be played anytime and defends against anything. Also, when you played the card, you can cure all of your sick children and turn all HEALTH cards up again.

- » Worksheet 2: WHAT DO THEY SAY Show what you know and fill in the blanks in your own words. What do the objects say they are? What is it, the objects can do

for you? Discuss the results in the class.

The yellow answer sheet introduces all characters with their corresponding statements. It helps you check if your answers given in the other two sheets were correct.
